Warm Our Hearts / Dry Our Feet Capital Campaign Update

The members and friends of St. Paul's Church have done it again!

Last month I reported on the donations of over \$30,000 that were contributed to our Capital Campaign by our generous and loyal members and friends. I also recognized the efforts of Pastor Kerin, who reached out to the Synod to obtain a grant of \$11,000, which is in addition to the contributions we received.

This month, I am so pleased to report that we have received a major gift in memory of Ken Hayes. This brings the total amount of money raised for our Warm Our Hearts / Dry Our Feet Capital Campaign to over \$82,000.

Our new boiler is installed and final glitches being addressed. We can now look forward and begin to

obtain estimates for the work that needs to be completed in our Parish Hall.

I want to recognize all of the people who have contributed to the campaign and continue to keep St. Paul's in their hearts.
