Current COVID SAFETY INFORMATION for Houses of Worship

Protocols for Covid have been removed in the Philadelphia area. If you follow the updates, you know that the mask requirements have been dropped. However, your Re-opening Team has decided to continue to mask while we are inside to protect those who are not yet vaccinated.

Those who are fully vaccinated (2 weeks following their last vaccination shot) will be invited to the option of masking inside the church building beginning on Sunday, July 4th. If you are not vaccinated, please continue to wear your mask when coming into the building. A sign-in sheet will be maintained for the time being. It will be helpful should contact tracing be necessary.

Hymn books will be available for use and we will continue to sing softly. I will ask that everyone continue to sing gently as we prayerfully hope and wait for the Philadelphia area to reach a 70% vaccination rate.

If you are not feeling well, please stay home. We will continue to live-stream worship on our St. Paul's Facebook

Please Note...

The Church building is beginning to open up slowly. We have welcomed back the AA Group to meet. We are planning a summer activity program for children in July. The Food Pantry continues to serve the needs of the food insecure here in Philly by providing pre-bagged food for people who come to the front door. The Sanctuary is open for prayer when people call Pastor ahead of time. Vaccinations will help us to be open sooner; many places are offering walk-in opportunities.

While we do not yet have a fully open building, Pastor and Courtney are in the building on a regular basis. If you need to come down to the church, please simply give Courtney a call to let her know that you will be in. If you are in possession of a church key, please let Courtney know you are in the building when you arrive. The Food Pantry is here twice a week and uses the front vestibule and Chapel. While we are in-person for worship and the Atrium and Bathroom have been open, the remainder of the building still needs to be readied before we can use it. Sophia Academy will also be in session during some of the summer months.
