A Message from our Pastor

Dear Beloveds,

As June drew to a close, I had a wonderful opportunity to welcome a family into our Sanctuary to say goodbye to a beloved member of their family. It's hard to see and feel the deep grieving of people who lose those close to them. Yet, at the same time, the message of resurrection could not be any closer.

During this particular funeral, I offered a welcome, prayers and a benediction for the family and guests. I was blessed to be able to listen to the impactful message of a family member as he held up his beloved Aunt words close as you go forth: for her deep family relationship and the ways in which she loved those around her and united family members. I traveled to the cemetery to help the family say goodbye and commit her body to the earth.

The young speaker's message rose throughout the sanctuary, saying that death has a very short-lived victory because life and resurrection claim the final word. Thanks be to God for this courageous and wise message! The proclamation of Luke's gospel asks the women who came to the tomb on Easter Morning, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has been raised!"

Indeed, Christ has been raised! As our baptismal liturgy states, "By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to new life in you." (ELW, p 230). And just as Christ has been raised to new life, we have the gift of new life here on earth and the promise that we will be with God in the heavenly realms when that time comes.

We have been set free from sin and death; set free to care for those in need; set free to care for one another! How can we begin to come back together after a long year of being apart? Pick up the phone or take up a pen or grab your texting device! We are planning for a new directory listing of those people in our midst to be published sometime in August. For now, continue reaching out to one another as you can in after worship.

Current COVID SAFETY INFORMATION for Houses of Worship

Protocols for Covid have been removed in the Philadelphia area. If you follow the updates, you know that the mask requirements have been dropped. However, your Re-opening Team has decided to continue to mask while we are inside to protect those who are not yet vaccinated.

Those who are fully vaccinated (2 weeks following their last vaccination shot) will be invited to the option of masking inside the church building beginning on Sunday, July 4th. If you are not vaccinated, please continue to wear your mask when coming into the building. A sign-in sheet will be maintained for the time being. It will be helpful should contact tracing be necessary.

Hymn books will be available for use and we will continue to sing softly. I will ask that everyone continue to sing gently as we prayerfully hope and wait for the Philadelphia area to reach a 70% vaccination rate.

If you are not feeling well, please stay home. We will continue to live-stream worship on our St. Paul's Facebook page.

Pray for the health and safety of the world and the people around you.


Let's continue to be aware of changing protocols and making sure we protect the most vulnerable in our midst the best we can.

The Church building is beginning to open up slowly. We have welcomed back the AA Group to meet. We are planning a summer activity program for children in July. The Food Pantry continues to serve the needs of the food insecure here in Philly by providing pre-bagged food for people who come to the front door. The Sanctuary is open for prayer when people call Pastor ahead of time. Vaccinations will help us to be open sooner; many places are offering walk-in opportunities.

While we do not yet have a fully open building, Pastor and Courtney are in the building on a regular basis. If you need to come down to the church, please simply give Courtney a call to let her know that you will be in. If you are in possession of a church key, please let Courtney know you are in the building when you arrive. The Food Pantry is here twice a week and uses the front vestibule and Chapel. While we are in-person for worship and the Atrium and Bathroom have been open, the remainder of the building still needs to be readied before we can use it. Sophia Academy will also be in session during some of the summer months.
