A Message from our Pastor

Blessed March Beloveds!

The teacher of little ones in me usually connects March with Lions and Lambs. The windy days (lions) of March give way to the calmness (lambs) of April; at least that's the way the story goes. Yet, that isn't exactly how the liturgical seasons unfold. In fact, the liturgical season turns worldly weather patterns upside down. Go figure.

The season of Lent that we are about to journey through is a time to take a deeper look at the signs that God is pointing us to. There are more than 500 "federally approved" signs for use to direct, protect, and inform the travelling public.[1] That's a LOT of information! There is also a move away from the use of words on signs and stick with symbols. Words can create language barriers, whereas symbols are more easily universal.

While the world's weather is winding up the winds, weather in the Christian community of faith is preparing us to listen for the still, small voice of God calling. During Lent, God whispers "Be still my beloveds. Set for a moment, or two, or three. And even if these things are difficult to do in the daily world you live in – focus your ears each day for the sounds of my Creation – a world I created in love for you."

Creation is a sign of blessing; to be seen, to be heard, and/or to be touched by. The world and all that is in it belongs to God. In God's eyes we are made in the deep love of God; loved and valued eternally.

What would it mean to take this message with us as we journey through Lent this year? Take the message of blessing and encouragement with you when you go shopping, when you go to work, or when you sit at lunch with your friends in school. When you happen to run into your Aunt Mary at the food store or talk with a friend you haven't seen in a while.

How might we be encouragers of the gospel; signs of God's gracious love to the world in the actions WE inhabit this season? Perhaps choose one day in the week and bless or encourage as many people as you can. Not flattery, but honest "seeing" of their gifts or character that you see. Maybe that means a silent prayer; maybe it means speaking it out loud. Create a blessing for someone you think of. A picture, a few words, or a prayer. Words of encouragement. It's all blessing.

The "upside-down-ness" of March as the church's season of Lent comes quietly in the midst of a loud and roaring mother nature is a sign that reminds us that Christ comes to us in ways we don't always see and, certainly, rarely expect. In the midst of calm or chaos, the Cross of Christ is our constant and consistent sign that we are loved.




Stewardship Highlights the work of the ALTAR GUILD and MEMORIALS at St. Paul's

Your impact in our call to spread the gospel is everywhere in the work of the Church. You are the hands and the feet of ministry, and the gift of your time and talent is important.
