Generosity is a gift given to every person. Sharing our gifts is an act of our faith in God. The verse above is from the second letter of St. Paul to the Corinthian church, asking for a collection for relief for the Christians at Jerusalem. This passage applies to us in 2021 too. If we look closely at the message, we note that "they gave themselves first to the Lord…..". This is where all gifts to ministry originate. It is the commitment to help others as God calls us to do. Within our own realities we make this commitment. What we give is our personal decision; ("...they voluntarily gave according to their means, and even beyond their means.")
